## Half and Whole Steps

The distance between two notes is called an interval.
The shortest distance between two notes is one half step. On the guitar one fret equals one half step.

Two frets equal one whole step.

The naturally occuring half steps in the musical alphabet are between B-C and E-F. They are separated by one fret on the guitar.

All remaining notes in the musical alphabet are separated by one whole step.

Practice writing in the notes of the musical alphabet on each string starting with the open string and ending on the fifteenth fret. Apply power chords, barre chords, and scales in the same way.
